- SCOR event planned in early August to refine ideas and changes regarding implementation and innovation focus; a strategic plan will be developed
- The connection between RAC and SCOR may be further defined
- TRB will be celebrating its 100 years anniversary in January 2020
- Airline volume increase was noted
- Suggestion to invite Dale Peabody to this regional RAC call in order to stay engaged with SCOR/RAC changes
- Inquiry regarding if AASHTO region geography will be affected
- Enhancements were made to websites such as HVR, AASHTO, etc. to increase communication
- Concern seems evident about the role of RAC regarding the Special Committee for Research and Innovation, particularly how appointments will be made.

Discussion topic – Technology Transfer

California – Using Technology Transfer for drones (UAVs), commercial vehicle, and automated vehicle locator (AVL). Also, using Technology Transfer to transform the view of the Research Office to not only research, but as service provider. The Caltrans Research Office facilitated a meeting with the Maintenance and Equipment Division to explain state of practice regarding snowplows. This showed how to incorporate technology with maintenance efforts. Keith Platte asked how this concept came about...Joe Horton responded with a shift in perspective from performing research to using research readily available and providing a service to answer questions in the agency.

Washington – Utilizing internet technology to share resources and information to the entire agency through a recently released concept called Webinar Wednesday. The research office chooses to take a proactive vs static approach by presenting information to the state DOT workforce. The PI and SME presented to ~190 employees mid-morning on a Wednesday. First topic was median filter drains and how funds were saved. These events are intended to be held once per quarter. A survey was issued and positive comments were received. Keith Platte inquired about how this was promoted. Response was complex in that high level clearance to share email with entire staff requires leadership's approval. But, the invitations will be approached differently next time, potentially through the internal website.

South Dakota – Embarking on a high mileage bus tour through Wyoming and Utah with focused stops in Cheyenne and Salt Lake City. Twelve hot topics have been identified with planned presentations and discussion sessions associated with each focus area. Trip is funded with a STIC grant for Division directors, staff engineers and technicians identified through their leadership, classification and geographic location. Keith Platte commented that FHWA is favoring the regional perspective for the STIC. Wyoming and Utah RAC members commented that they are looking forward to the exchange.

New Mexico – mentioned that FHWA and executive management have differing opinions on equipment and operations falling under the tech transfer umbrella. Randall Soderquist will introduce this question to RAC Region 4 through a survey.

AASHTO Standing Committee on Research and Innovation

— Direction for 2017 —

Objectives

1. Provide a coordinated direction from the AASHTO Board of Directors about how research funding will be allocated and spent, while at the same time not discouraging jurisdictions from developing innovative ideas for new research.

This is in accordance with the goals of the realigned AASHTO Committee structure.

2. Define processes and procedures to assure research translates into national policy at the committee level and results in the field at the state level.

Deliverables

The AASHTO Standing Committee on Research and Innovation will provide the following:

1. A process for selecting research projects which aligns with the policy direction provided by the AASHTO Board of Directors. Soliciting of innovations and research ideas will be tied to this process. This item will be delivered at the early summer workshop by the Standing Committee on Research and Innovation.
2. Processes and procedures for translating research into national policies and results at the state level. These items will be delivered at the early summer workshop by the Standing Committee on Research and Innovation.
3. A detailed presentation to the AASHTO Board of Directors with associated talking points for the annual meeting in September. The presentation will be developed during the summer by AASHTO staff.

Recommended Regional “Sweet Sixteen” and Supplemental Brochures Selection Process

This guidance was put together to help standardize the Sweet Sixteen selection process with the understanding that each region will be able to modify the guidelines to meet their needs. Each Region shall review and vote on their regional Sweet Sixteen submittals starting April 1 through April 30.

The selection of the supplemental brochures will be based on the High Value Research (HVR) regional votes on safety projects and the selected additional topic for that year.

Research Advisory Council (RAC) region chairs must submit their final ballots to the Value of Research Task force for the Sweet Sixteen projects and overall ranking of supplemental brochure projects no later than May 15. This will allow the Sweet Sixteen recipient states ample time to decide on attending and to prepare their presentations for the RAC / TRB State Representatives Annual Meeting typically held in July. It will also provide time to develop the Supplemental Brochures that highlight the safety and another research topic.

Recommended steps in the voting process:

Step 1: After HVR submittal deadline (March 1), RAC regional chairs will coordinate their regional voting process for Sweet Sixteen projects, the safety supplemental brochure, and the additional supplemental brochure, the topic of which will be selected annually. Prior to the voting period, the Value of Research Task will identify the additional supplemental brochure topic based on the most popular (by number of submittals) category of projects. Each Region will be asked to provide four Sweet Sixteen projects, two additional safety projects, and two additional projects on the selected additional topic for inclusion in the supplemental brochures.

Step 2: The RAC region chair compiles the HVR projects for their region from the HVR website (<http://www.highvalueresearch.org>) and facilitates the voting for their top four HVR projects and both supplemental brochures.

The recommended process for voting is:

- Each RAC member should rank the projects in order of value, with one (1) being the top candidate project. Please note that RAC members should not rank their own state’s projects.
- Each region may set up its own scoring protocol, but may use the following as a guideline.
 - Projects may address areas of expertise that are not common to state DOT research programs.
 - Research managers should be careful not to be naturally biased when rating projects that fall into their own expertise. To help address this concern, research managers may want to seek the advice of others in their agency to review and rate projects.
 - Projects may address topical or business areas that are not represented in all state DOTs. For example, only a portion of state DOTs handle motor vehicle functions, but some DOTs

- fund policy or safety-related research that relate to motor vehicle activities. Evaluators should take this into account and review projects based on the merit to the sponsor agency, even if their own agency may not have an application for the research.
- Evaluators should understand the impacts of projects considering both breadth and depth. For example, one project may have a minor impact across a wide range of applications. Another project might have a major impact in a single or small set of applications. Either project may be considered to have high value.
 - The Regional Chair will collate the ballots from their region to create a ranked list of the submitted projects and will submit the list to the Value of Research Task Force.

Step 3: From the collated ballots, the Region Chair will identify the top four projects from their region as Sweet Sixteen projects and submit the list to the Value of Research Task Force. Note that the four HVR projects must come from different states.

STEP 4: The Region Chair will also identify the next two safety projects from each region for inclusion in the Safety Supplemental Brochure.

They will then identify the next most popular HVR topic and similarly the next two projects on that topic from each region will be included in that topic's Supplemental Brochure for the year.
