		Value of Research – Worked on a draft brochure for CEO's and Congress. Reviewed the 123 highest value research projects in nation narrowed it down to the Sweet 16. Published the Elite 8 in brochure distributed during the summer meeting. Working with NCHRP 20-63 to quantify the value of research and anticipated performance measures. Sometimes the answer is "Not to do."

		Jack Jernigan discussed the Pooled Funds Program – Federal Highway supports it and wants continued growth. They like partnering effort and leverage of resources. Revised guidelines on website. Pooled Fund will continue hosting webinars. Tommy asked if a Pooled Fund Project can begin without full funding commitment? (Still in solicitation stage.) He thinks no, not good idea. Others suggested breaking the project down into stages, or provide contract language that says "based on available Federal Funding."

7.	State Updates	Iowa - Sandra invited everyone to the Research Symposium & Peer Exchange August 18-19, 2011. Research in Iowa is fine, 355 retired from IDOT – fill half the positions.
		Ohio – has finished their strategic plan and is starting to roll it out in the agency. They are taking their road show to the Universities and are reviewing S.P. and engaging them into

Research. They are working on implementation improvement and evaluations at the completion of projects.

Wisconsin – Held their Peer Exchange in May will discuss at 10:30 session today. Hosting Mid-Continent Transportation Research Forum on Aug. 19-20, 2010 in Madison

Missouri – Mara passed out MoDOT research successes. No director at MoDOT now. National search for new director.

Kansas – Passed a new 10 year, \$8 billion highway program. They are in the process of signing new K-TRAN contracts for new fiscal year.

Indiana – Has new leadership in Research. The DOT will Concentrate on Internal Marketing. Everyone will keep doing their same job. They have 127 projects this year vs. 187 last year. Purdue will subcontract some contracts. Federal Highway has changed their research person for Indiana.

Minnesota – Now has a Knowledge Network for Technology Transfer online and Project web pages. They are using Twitter to blog and Facebook, and have videos online. They also provide Portfolio Management Assessment of Research Program which are "Road Maps" for Project areas, flow charting financial processes.

Michigan – Held a Research summit in May where Research needs were introduced for 2010/2011 Research Projects. They also spotlighted 8 projects. Calvin sent out a newsletter to all the other states. They will be hosting Peer Exchange Dec. 7-9, 2010 on the Topic of Implementation. Michigan is negotiating new contracts with their Universities. A sticking issue is intellectual Property Rights.

Illinois – Completed their second round of Solicitations on June 30. Their Executive Committee will meet and vote in Oct. – Nov. They had a Federal Highway Process Review and found they need guidelines for contract research projects for DOT people. These guidelines will be added to their Research Manual. They are beginning negotiations for a new 3 year intergovernmental agreement with University of Illinois. Their legislature decided all communications with vendors and contractors must be documented and posted on the web. This is causing problems. Illinois is also furloughing non-union employees 12 days per year.
